

Collection Records Spreadsheet

Teachers should keep a record of scientifically significant events (i.e. date, weather information, catch volumes observed, and incidence of trap disturbance) on the spreadsheet provided here. This record should be submitted along with the specimen collection bottles and the trap at the end of the collection period. These records sheets may be hung up in the classroom as a tool for student engagement throughout the deployment period.

EXAMPLE:

Week 1	Monday, September 19	19°C	Partly cloudy (50%)	Below line 1 (~20 insects)*	Trap collapsed at back, had to re-secure. Specimen collection bottle appears fine.
